



Wedding Invitations

Below are three examples of how to word your invitations for our various menu styles.

1-Chef's Buffet, Semi Sit Down, Family Style, European Station Buffet

If you're having one of the above menus, it's not necessary to list specific entree options on the wedding invitation. Instead, you can simply state that there will be a {dinner style} without specifying the dishes.

For example:

"Please join us for a buffet style dinner celebrating the wedding of [Couple's Names] [date, time, location]"

This communicates to guests that they'll be offered a buffet style dinner without specifying the specific entrees.

2-Sit Down Dinner-Dual Entrée Option

If offering a dual entrée plated sit-down dinner, it's not necessary to list specific entree options on the wedding invitation. Instead, you can simply state that there will be a dual entrée of beef and chicken for each guest.

For example:

[Wedding Invitation Header]

Dear [Guest's Name],

We are delighted to invite you to celebrate the marriage of [Couple's Names]. Your presence will add to the joy of our special day.

3-Sit Down Dinner-Single Entrée “Choices” Option

If offering a single entrée choice for your plated sit-down dinner, the example below is a good starting point.
